## MARTHA HUGHES CANNON

1857-1932



When Utah became a state in 1896, its
Constitution restored Utah women's voting
rights and allowed women to hold office. That
year, Utahns elected Dr. Martha "Mattie"
Hughes Cannon as Utah's—and the nation's—
first female state senator.

- Worked as a typesetter at the Woman's Exponent and later earned four degrees in chemistry, medicine, pharmaceuticals, and public speaking
- Set up a private medical practice and became the resident physician at the woman-run Deseret Hospital in Salt Lake City
- Testified about women's suffrage to U.S.
   congressional committees and was a featured
   speaker at the 1893 World's Fair in Chicago
- Authored Utah's sanitation laws, passed several legislative bills revolutionizing public health, and was a founder and member of Utah's first State Board of Health
